Wadesboro Park 75% Complete!

The First phase of the Wadesboro Park, located on Gatewood St. just off Morven Rd., is about 75% complete. The 46-acre site currently has a 7/10-mile paved walking trail, two large picnic shelters, rest rooms and a forty-car parking lot. The trail winds around about 30 acres of the site and is lighted. Though the Park is not officially open many citizens are using the trail, which the Town encourages.

A playground and benches around the trail are currently being installed. The Town, also, hopes to install a volleyball court, horseshoe pits and probably an enclosure where owners can run their dogs.

Charles and Hal Little families donated the property to the Town. The late Henry Little spearheaded the effort to bring the





property and the Town together to produce an open area within the Town limits for the use and benefit of the public. Several local groups helped raise funds for the construction including the Yost Foundation, an anonymous donor and Wal-Mart. Timber sales raised other funds and all of the local funds are being matched by a state grant.

A Park Planning Committee headed by Jim Strayhorn and Dr. Don Altieri determined early on that the Park should be devoted to passive, family oriented activity. As a result there are two multiacre, grassy fields bisecting the area where unorganized recreational activities can take place. Woods surround the property and rough walking trails that maybe developed at a later date.
